The presiding officer has the right and power to control the meeting and may take whatever actions are necessary to ensure an orderly meeting, including: 1. Prohibiting harassing, repetitive and/or frivolous comments, or statements which constitute personal attacks, insults, or offenses directed specifically at an individual, which instantly inflict injury or tend to incite an immediate breach of the peace or otherwise constitute unprotected "fighting words" under federal court jurisprudence; 2. Removing individuals from meetings if they are disruptive, including contacting law enforcement; 3. Call for recess or adjournment to restore order. The Board asks the audience to refrain from responding to the speaker's comments, including cheering and applauding, so that all Board members can focus their attention entirely on the speaker. Although the Board may ask clarifying questions, please be reminded that the Board cannot respond directly to any comments made this evening.
