IV. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

In order for the Board to fulfill its obligation to complete the planned agenda in an effective and efficient manner, a maximum of thirty (30) minutes of public participation is scheduled. A district resident who wishes to address the Board is encouraged to inform the Superintendent at least one (1) week prior to a regularly scheduled or adjourned meeting of the Board and provide both name and the specific item(s) to be presented to the Board. The Superintendent will have the resident's name placed on the agenda. A sign in sheet is available at the door of every board meeting. Anyone wishing to be recognized shall make himself/herself known by completing and submitting a registration sheet to the Board President prior to the start of the meeting. No presentation shall exceed three (3) minutes. If multiple speakers indicate a desire to speak on the same issue, the presiding officer shall relate the board's desire that the speakers designate two (2) people to speak for the group. The presiding officer has the right and power to control the meeting and may take whatever actions are necessary to ensure an orderly meeting, including: 1. Prohibiting harassing, repetitive and/or frivolous comments, or statements which constitute personal attacks, insults, or offenses directed specifically at an individual, which instantly inflict injury or tend to incite an immediate breach of the peace or otherwise constitute unprotected "fighting words" under federal court jurisprudence; 2. Removing individuals from meetings if they are disruptive, including contacting law enforcement; 3. Call for recess or adjournment to restore order. The Board asks the audience to refrain from responding to the speaker's comments, including cheering and applauding, so that all Board members can focus their attention entirely on the speaker. Although the Board may ask clarifying questions, please be reminded that the Board cannot respond directly to any comments made this evening.

ESSER Fund Usage

Option 1: Expand the Elementary School. The Elementary would be expanded to allow for 3 classrooms with an indoor play area. Project would all be completed by the spring 2024. By choosing this option, the following would occur: The Elementary Building would house PK-1, 2-4 would move to either the Intermediate or Trenton Ave. Building, the Middle School would house grades 5-7 and the High School would hold grades 8-12.

Option 2: Expand the HS by adding six classrooms with an extra Industrial Arts area. The project would be completed by the spring of 2024. This expansion would result in the Elementary housing grades PK-K, either the Intermediate or Trenton Ave. would house grades 1-3, the Middle School would house grade 4-6 and both 7th and 8th grade moving to the HS making it a 7-12 buildings.

Option 3: Put money into renovating existing buildings. Do not close any buildings.

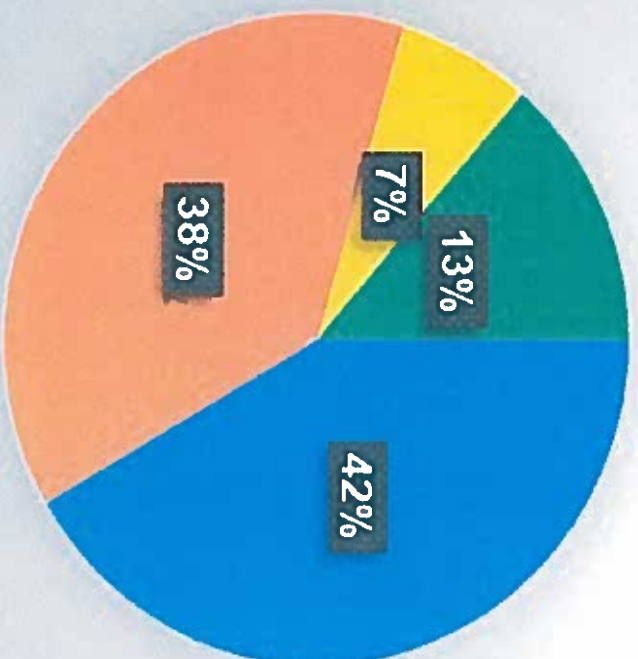
Additional Options and Other Discussions

Put money into renovating existing buildings, which doesn't close any building. Realign current buildings as following options:

- PK - K Primary (Trenton), Grades 1 -2 to Elementary (Eastport), Grades 3-5 would be at the Intermediate and all other buildings would remain the same.
- PK - K Elementary (Eastport, Grades 1 - 2 Primary (Trenton), Grades 3-5 would be located at the Intermediate and all other buildings would remain the same.
- Convert the Central Office into a preschool building.

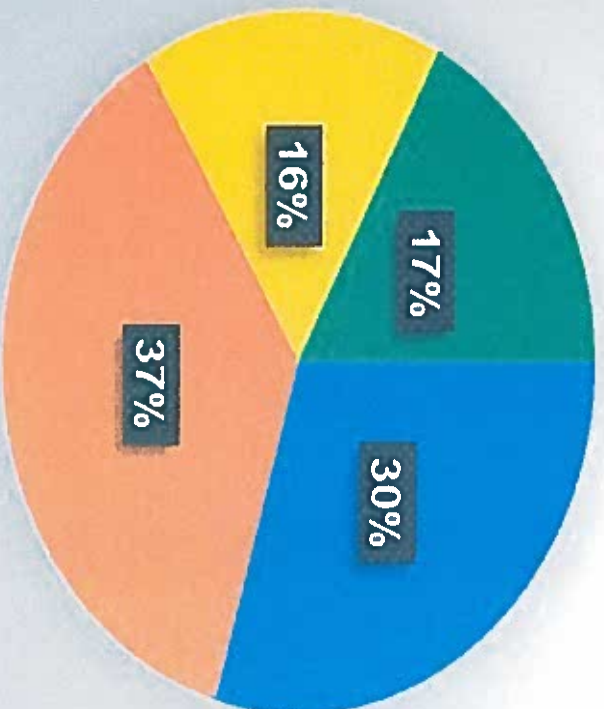
Future plans would be to have a campus and only have two buildings.

Expansion Option



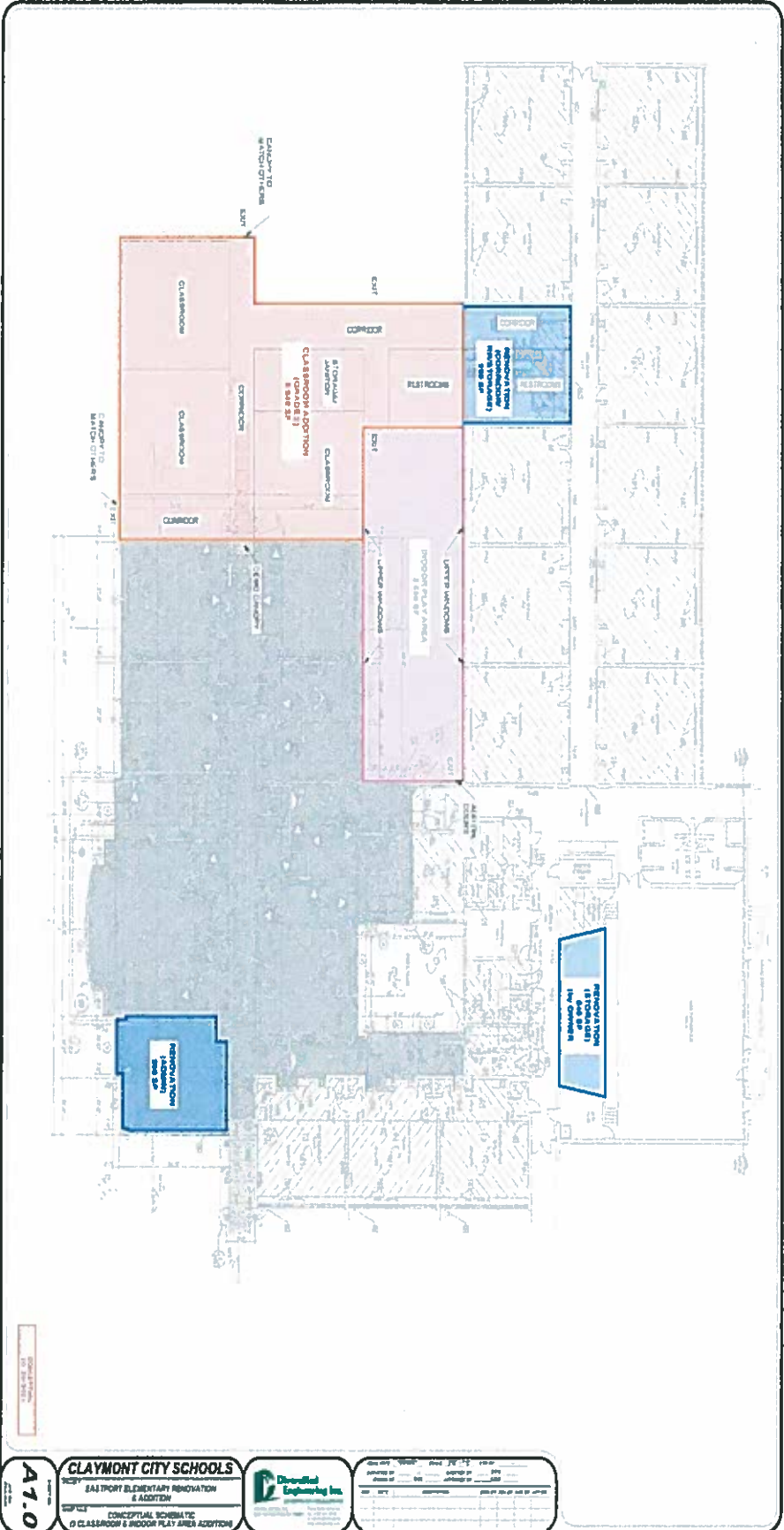

Buildings would realign and depending on Board decision which building would close.

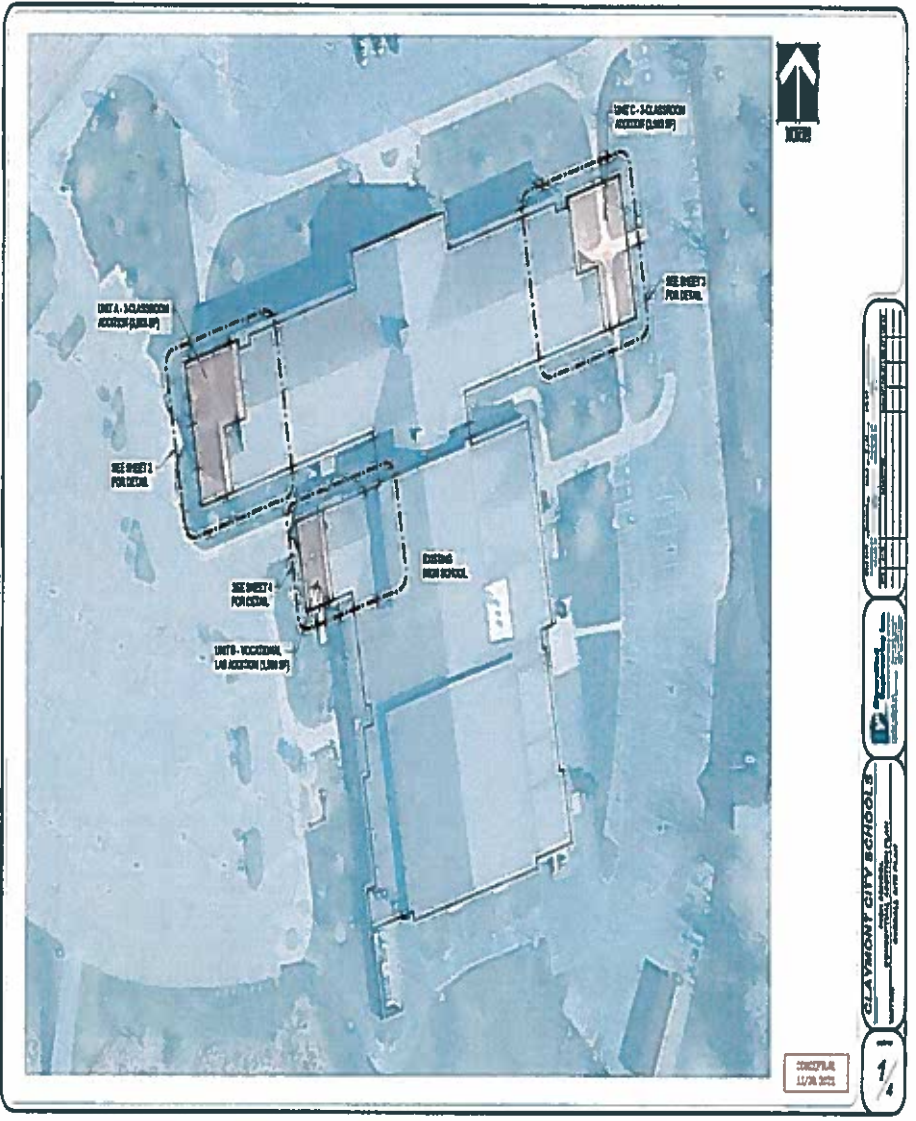

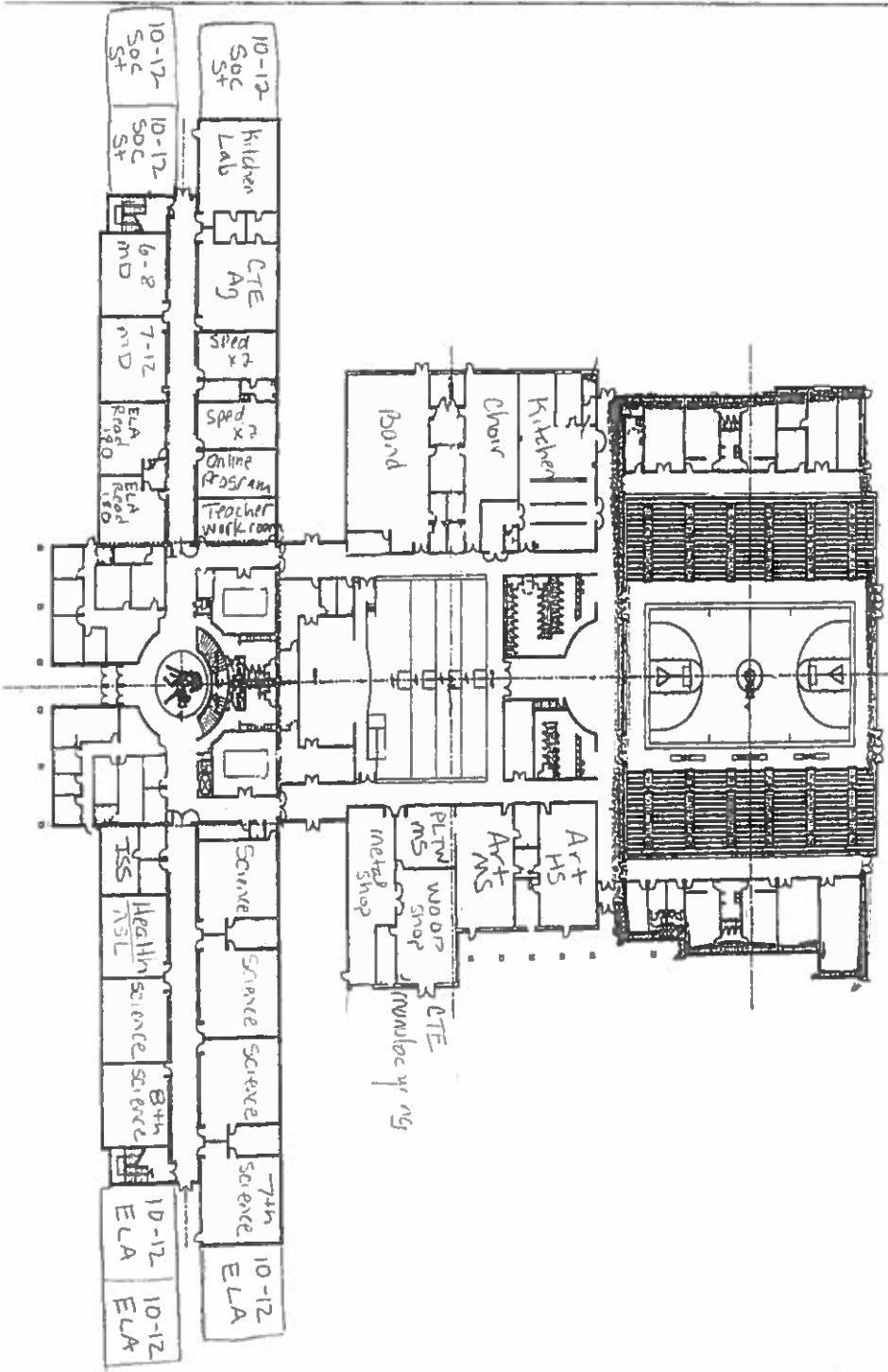

Option 2: High School Expansion- additional 6 classrooms and vocational space

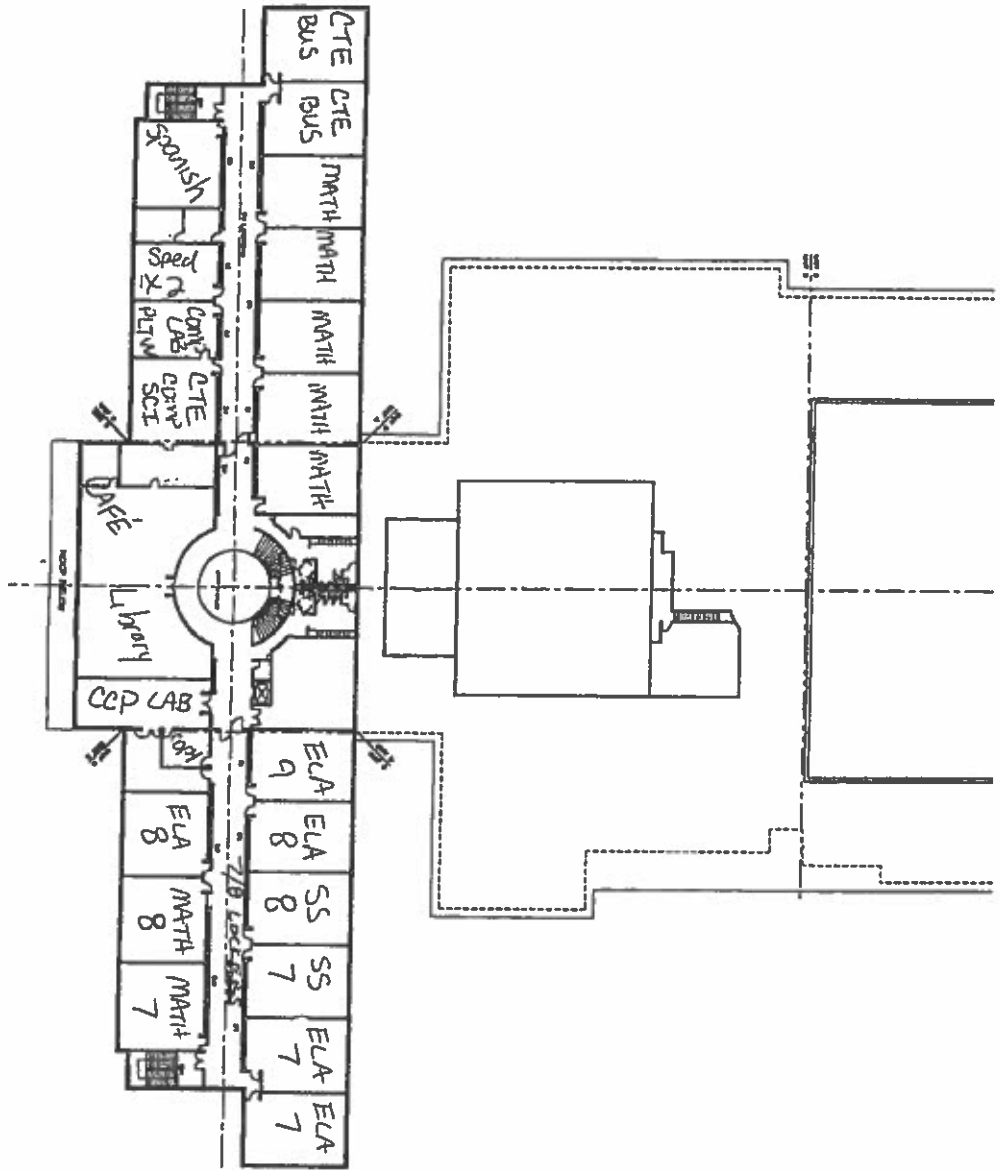
